

### **Ceramic Sanitaryware products.**

- For general cleaning, use a mild, nonabrasive soap or bleach and warm water or a mild all-purpose bathroom cleaner in every 1 or 2 days.
- Do not use abrasive cleaners. Such cleaners contain sand or silica and will eventually scratch the surface.
- Common bowl cleaners may be used on the **glossy / matt** surface of the toilet pan.
- For **glossy / matt** wash basins and bowls, apply with a sponge or soft cloth and rinse the surface thoroughly with plenty of water. It will help to maintain the surface shine and keep the product hygiene.
- Use of metal brush will create metalmarks on the surface of ceramic.
- **If accidental glaze scratches or abrasions occur, the surface finish cannot be restored.**

### **Caution**

- Take care while using in-tank bowl cleaners. Some in-tank cleaners contain calcium hydrochloride, which may be harmful to tank components like rubber, metal and / or plastic components of tank parts causing leaks and hindering toilet performance.
- Flush away cleaners or bleach after cleaning the pan.
- Bleach can be harmful both orally and on your cloths, so always wear rubber gloves and ensure you rinse properly. Ensure proper ventilation as bleach gives off strong fumes.
- Never try to flush away disposable nappies / sanitary napkins.
- **Suggesting that, not to use Matt finish ceramic basins / bowls for washing / rinsing the hair dye etc.. coloring agents.**
- Rinse away dentures cleaners and hair dyes that may damage bowl and bathroom surfaces.
- Make sure that deposits are removed immediately as they can cause stains if left for any length of time.
